Contra Costa County Fire- Engine 8 (Concord), Engine 6(Concord), Truck 6(Concord), Engine 22(Concord), Engine 10(Concord), Engine 5(Pleasant Hill), Breathing Support 7 (Walnut Creek), Battalion 2 (Concord), Battalion 1(Pleasant Hill), Safety Officer 10(Concord) Investigator 20 (Pittsburg) and 1 Paramedic Unit & 1 Paramedic Supervisor responded to a reported residential structure fire in a single family, single story dwelling at the address above. Upon arrival Engine 8 light smoke coming from eaves of a single story, single family home and established Clayton IC. E22 was assigned primary fire attack, Truck 6 was assigned to ventilate the roof, and additional units supported these operations commensurate with the strategic objectives. All units were committed for the length of the incident. A fire cause and origin investigation was conducted and the determination was made of an accidental fire in the kitchen. Significant water and smoke damage resulted and the fire was contained to the building of origin. During this incident, Engine 2(Pleasant Hill) covered Station 5. Engine 9(Pacheco) covered the city of Concord. There were no injuries to Firefighters or civilians. Unfortunately one dog succumbed to injuries consistent with smoke inhalation.
