Contra Costa County Fire- Engine 88 (Antioch), Engine 82 (Antioch), Battalion 8 (Pittsburg) Medic Supervisor (Concord), Medic 80 & Medic 82 (Concord), Breathing Support 7 (Walnut Creek), Investigator 20 (Pittsburg), PIO Hill and PIO Dutter responded to a medical aid that was reported with one Antioch PD Officer shot. The incident was immediately upgraded to an Active Shooter incident. Upon hearing the initial dispatch Captain 88 requested an additional engine and an Air Ambulance. Shortly after that it was learned that APD transported the Officer to the Hospital. Battalion 8 responded and requested EMS 8 and to continue all units. The incident continued to escalate and more Law Enforcement units arrived. Battalion 8 Met with APD Supervisor and Established Deerfield Command in Unified Command with APD. The incident evolved into a long hostage incident and was downgraded from an active shooter. In the end 1 APD Officer was transported and subsequently released. Hostage negotiations continued until approximately 2 am when the suspect surrendered to APD

Officers. All units supported these operations commensurate with the strategic objectives. All units were committed for the length of the incident. During this incident there were no injuries to Firefighters or civilians.
