SUBJECT: Hearing of Abatement Report

 - a) more than once,
 - b) through clerical error,
 - c) through the error or mistake of a material fact, or
 - d) illegally."

FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT

Reviewed/discussed the February 10, 2020 Fire Chief's report.

COMMISSIONERS' COMMENTS / ITEMS FOR FUTURE AGENDAS

Egan – Thanks to author of wind event report. It was great reading and a great response from the District. Personnel coming in and staying over is reflective of their commitment.

Nakano – What are your short-term challenges now?

Chief Broschard – We have a lot of new employees and probationary personnel at every rank and we're very busy. So, two things:

(1) Developing medium term plan to deal with operational capacity over the next two to five years. That corresponds with pension obligation bond debt service going down in July 2021 and then away in July 2022. Will give us the opportunity to build a more resilient organization and get our staffing up.

(2) Making sure we have a safe environment for our employees. We are focusing on training, safety, and wellness of all of our personnel. That partially involves additional staffing and partially making sure procedures are updated and followed. We're starting our second round of annual physicals with a state of the art program that includes full body scans. Because of this program, significant issues were discovered with a couple of our folks that they otherwise would not have known about. Next element of safety for our personnel will be mental wellbeing for first responders, connecting them with practitioners.

Fields – Applauds addressing of mental health. Suicide is a real issue. Also, there are grant opportunities available that I think we would qualify for that would benefit CON EMS such as field trial for power/auto loading gurneys. Currently paying the consequences for manually lifting for so long.

Chief Broschard – This sounds similar to Lucas device benefits. We will look into it.

Daugelli – Grandparents of one of my students had a garage fire in Antioch. He said fire department handled everything well.



RE: Fire Chief's Report

- Remembering Fire Captain Matt Burton and Engineer Scott Desmond. Thirteen years ago, on July 21, 2007, our District tragically lost two of our finest in the line of duty, giving their lives in an effort to save the lives of others at a structure fire in San Pablo.

While we honor them every day, we engaged in several activities the week of July 20, including a safety stand down across the District to review the incident and ensure its lessons are learned, observed, and not forgotten. We also made a District-wide radio ring down call at 8 a.m. on July 21 followed by a moment of silence, conducted a brief remembrance at our Memorial Wall, and flags were flown at half-staff at all our facilities as a public remembrance of our loss. The remembrance at the Memorial Wall was livestreamed on Twitter and Facebook and is archived for future viewing.

We will continue the practice of honoring and remembering Scott and Matt's sacrifice as part of our annual Fallen Firefighter Memorial Service which we will conduct to coincide with the Annual California Firefighters Memorial Ceremony in mid-September.

- Fireworks Related Fire Activity. In the weeks leading up to the Independence Day holiday, pervasive illegal fireworks use across the District served to further ramp up grass and vegetation fires.

Anticipating significant fireworks-related activity, we up-staffed significantly for the July 3-5 weekend, adding additional crews and apparatus, as well as chief officers and support staff. For the evening of July 4 itself, this included fully staffing our District Operations Center in addition to the supplemental crews and equipment, a move that proved critical to managing severely strained resources in one of the worst fireworks prone fire periods on record.

During the entire Independence Day weekend, there were 93 fires. On the evening of July 4, in the five-hour period from 7 p.m. to midnight, the District dispatched firefighting resources to 63 grass, structure, and other fires, including those burning in backyards, in dumpsters, and vehicles.

In the busiest hours of the weekend, 9 to 11 p.m. on the Fourth of July, both dispatchers and firefighters were stretched to the limit by an unprecedented level of calls to the Contra Costa Regional Fire Communications Center. Crews were dispatched to nearly 50 fire incidents alone. At the height of this two-hour period, due to demand for emergency services, Con Fire was forced to limit assignments, for all but structure fires, to a single fire engine, increasing risks for both residents and firefighters.

Despite 60-plus grass, vegetation, and other exterior fires burning across the District the evening of July 4, not a single structure was lost. In one of the most dangerous fires, near Southwood and Oak Hills Drives in Pittsburg, more than 20 homes were threatened with fire burning to within 30 feet of several homes. Some 20 fire apparatus and crews worked for more than hour to contain this blaze without involvement of any homes.

Of the 13 structure fires occurring over the weekend, three are known to have been caused by illegal fireworks use, and others are suspected of the same. Thanks to quick reporting and fire responses, damage in each of these cases was minor.

EMS calls were also up significantly over non-holiday periods with some of this increase likely attributable to fireworks activity. There were at least three fireworks related injuries reported with one involving an adult male whose hand was blown off from fireworks; one with an eye injury to a juvenile; and another with burn injuries to a patient's torso. On July 4, 378 EMS incidents were responded to with 232 transports. During a non-holiday period, daily transports average approximately 200.

- Fire Season Update. We experienced a challenging start to this year's fire season with a nearly 400 percent increase in vegetation fires in June as compared to the previous year.

In June and July, we contributed multiple resources to two out-of-County strike teams in addition to supporting intra-County task forces around the Independence Day holiday. We also dispatched engines in mutual aid to Solano and other northern California counties and filled numerous specialized single resource positions on fires around the state. Significant resource commitments to large fires in the East Contra Costa Fire Protection District were common throughout the months of June and July.

Since the Independence Day holiday, more favorable weather conditions have seen a slight decrease in grass and vegetation fires though we are still responding to several each day. As we move into the traditionally more wildfire-prone months of August, September, and October, we expect fire frequency and danger to rise once again. Recent long-range weather forecast models suggest a late start to our area receiving consistent wetting rains. Additionally, local fuel moisture levels (the quantity of water in trees and brush) are already at the low levels normally seen in October.

- Fire Control Worker Program Update. Crew 12, the first of an eventual two crews in this new fire season program, has now been on the job for two months and continues to respond to wildfires in its support role and also conduct weed abatement and fuel reduction activities of its own. During the July 4 holiday weekend, with Cal Fire hand crews sidelined due to COVID-19 quarantine protocols, Crew 12 was contracted by the State on a reimbursable basis to fill the gap on fires in the local Santa Clara Cal Fire unit. In addition to responding to local fires in Contra Costa and Alameda County, they spent seven days assigned to the “Crews” fire in Santa Clara County.
- Fire Prevention Bureau. Beginning June 1, our Fire Prevention Bureau began inspections of properties across the District for weed abatement and exterior hazard compliance. As we saw last fire season, the actions of property owners well ahead of fires were critically important to our ability to limit danger to structures. We are prioritizing these efforts on the most egregious offenders first, with many notices of unsatisfactory inspections already delivered to property owners that have resulted in the District’s weed abatement contractor being hired to abate many non-compliant parcels.

We are also redoubling our efforts to communicate wildland fire season messaging to all residents, including having created a new wildfire preparation webpage and creating a schedule of regular social media and other announcements. In partnership with Cal Fire, we have also added interactive content to our website affording property owners and other residents the opportunity to self-assess – and correct, where necessary – their individual weed abatement and defensible space situations.

State mandated inspections are proceeding well with just over 91% of the 7,478 initial inspections completed just over halfway through the calendar year. Of these, the apartment category, with the largest total number of inspections required by far, is at 93% with schools close behind at 85%. All categories of mandated inspections are on track for completion this year.

- COVID-19 Crisis Management. As exposures and infections have ramped up across the County and state, we have seen an increase in the incidence of symptoms and the need for testing amongst our employees. Still, our crew and employee protection measures continue to perform well, helping us hold the line on infections and protect our patients. However, recognizing complacency as a continuing threat, we are reevaluating our operational and administrative protective measures and reinforcing them with all employees. We continue to monitor the evolving situation, especially infections and deaths in first responder organizations, and remain prepared to adapt as may become necessary.

Logistically, we have sufficient stocks of PPE for our immediate and expected needs. Based on recommendations from County Health, we are exploring options for regular testing of asymptomatic personnel.

We have initiated conversations with Red Cross, Contra Costa County OES, and CalFire regarding fire season and other evacuation and sheltering orders while we remain under COVID-19 conditions and precautions. We have identified several solutions to the need for social distancing, particularly in such settings, and we continue to collaborate with these partners and other fire and law enforcement jurisdictions.

- Academy 55 Update. Academy 55 graduated in a largely virtual ceremony at our training grounds in Concord on July 17. The event was organized to allow recruits and limited numbers of their family and friends to participate, socially distanced, in person. Others, including the public, were invited to participate via the livestreamed version on our Facebook page where the video is archived for future viewing. The five experienced firefighter-paramedic graduates have since received their assignments and are now serving in their probationary assignments in companies throughout the District.
- REACH Partnership. Training began in July for Con Air 1's additional hoist rescue and fire suppression missions with the goal of having aerial firefighting capable by early September and hoist rescue by mid-October. Both aircraft continue to operate in air ambulance-only roles, currently. The value of two air ambulance aircraft was proven on July 8 when, with Con Air 2 responding to a hospital inter-facility transfer, Con Air 1 was dispatched in support of a multiple victim shooting incident. On another incident near Byron, both helicopters were dispatched together to a major injury vehicle accident with multiple victims requiring air transport to a trauma center. Overall response times continue to improve because of the integration of these resources into the Fire District.
- Ambulance Transport Program. We continue to monitor 911 emergency ambulance transport volume in relation to our deployed unit hours. We are currently experiencing transport volumes at approximately 90% of normal levels. Since May, we have reduced our deployed daily ambulance unit hours by approximately 10% to reduce operating costs and attempt to better match demand and deployment capacity. At the height of the COVID crisis we were experiencing transport volume as low as 28% below normal levels, but we are now starting to see transport and call volume numbers rise to levels closer to those normally seen during this time of year.
