# Exterior Hazard Control Standards

1. Parcels five acres or less in size:
  - Abate all combustible vegetation i.e.: weeds and grass no more than 3 inches tall
  - Abate all dead and dying vegetation
  - Limb up trees 10 feet
  - Abate all combustible trash and rubbish
2. Parcels greater than five acres in size:
  - 30 foot disked perimeter break and 15 foot disked cross breaks, or
  - 60 foot mowed perimeter break and 30 foot mowed cross breaks
  - Dividing the parcels into 5 acre sections
  - Abate all dead/dying vegetation
  - Limb up all trees 10 feet
3. Fuel break along roadways:
  - Cleared 10 feet from black top edge



# Exterior Hazard Control Standards

## 4. Cropland / Pastureland / Orchards

- 15 foot fuel break with animals
- 30 foot fuel break without animals
- Orchards complete abatement

## 5. Trees/Tree litter

Limb all trees up 10 feet

Remove all leaf litter/accumulated duff/tree bark/downed limbs

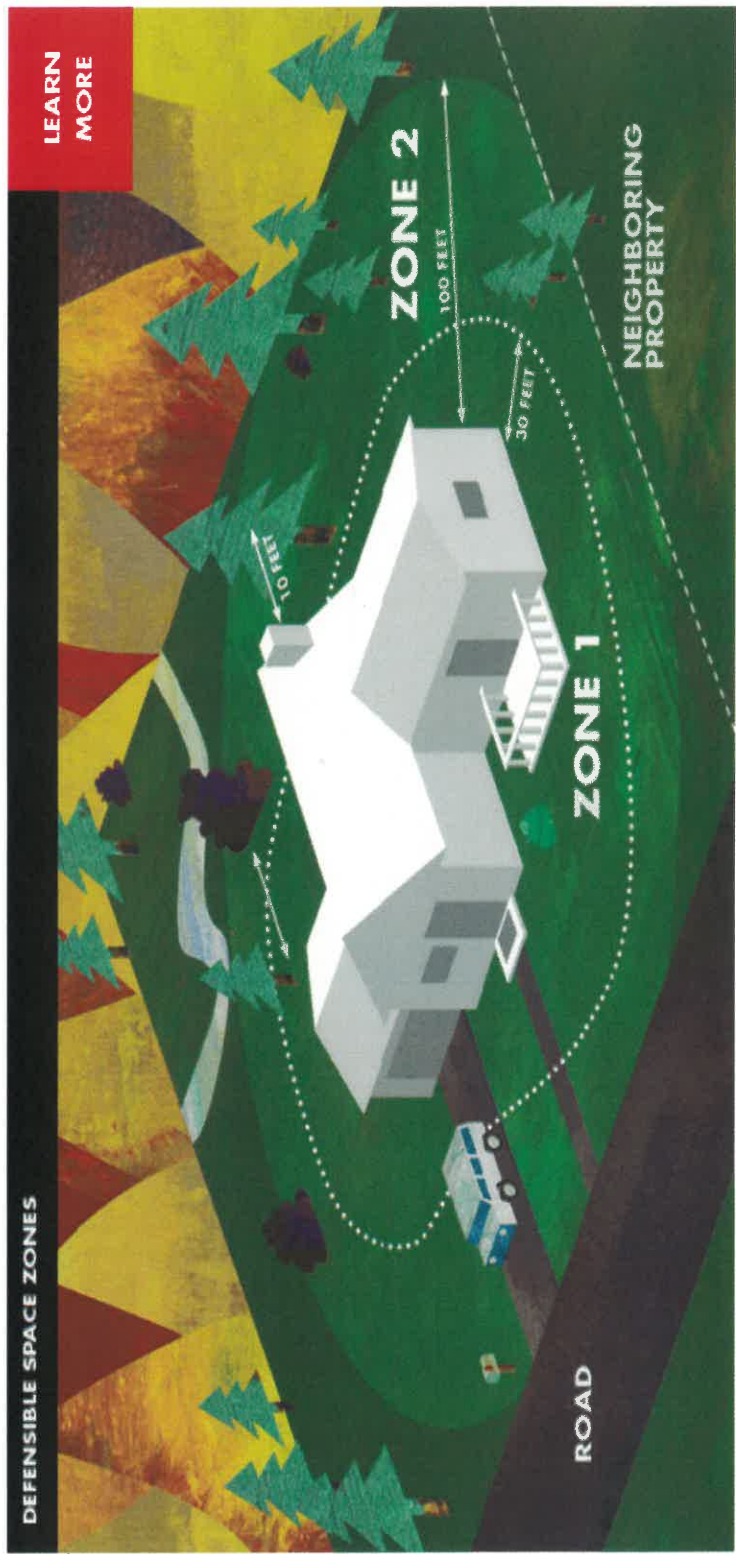
## 6. Cut Logs

- 3 inches or larger in diameter, ok to leave in neat stacks, 15 feet away from any buildings

## 7. Mulch and Mulch Piles

- Use medium or large chunk mulch, PLEASE no gorilla hair mulch
- Mulch piles to be stored 15 feet away from any buildings

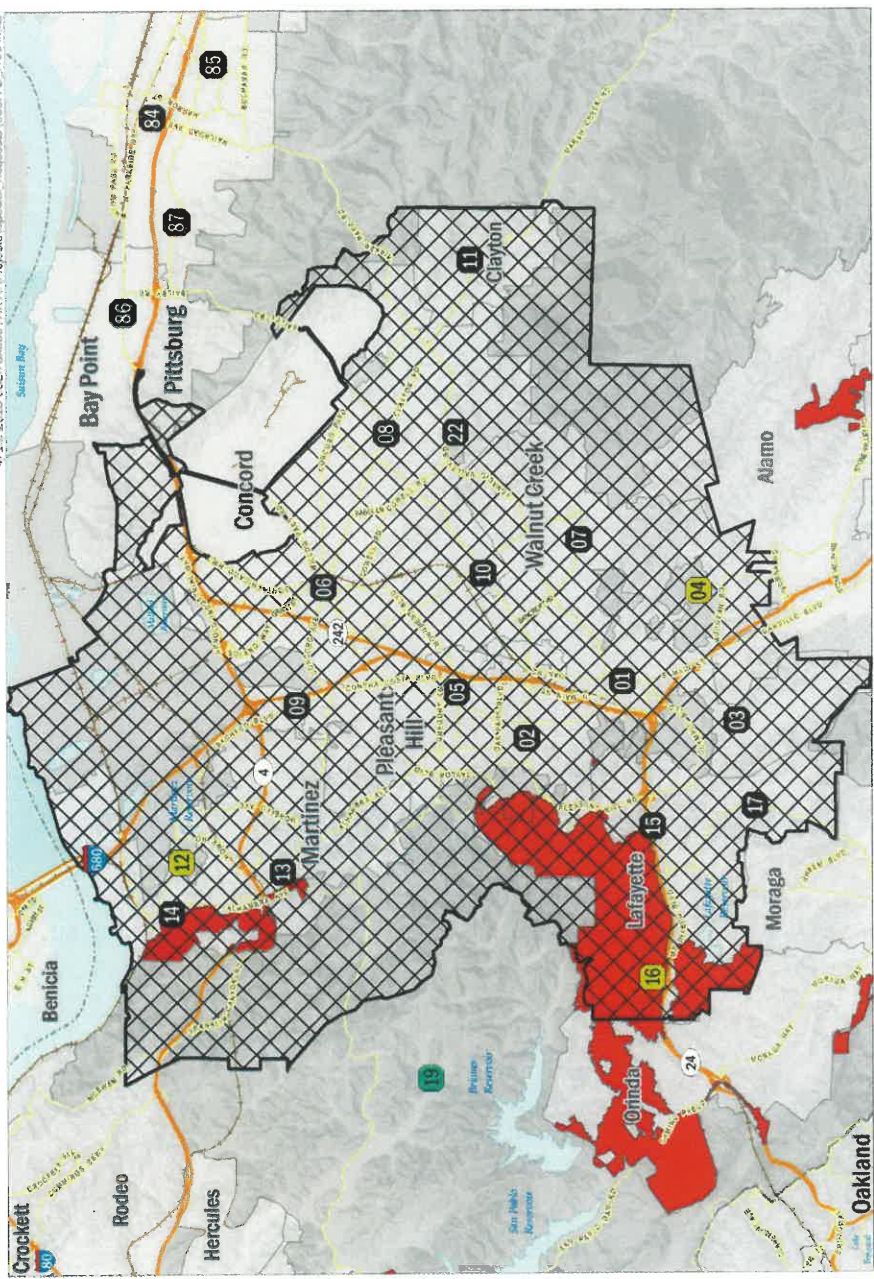

# High Fire Severity Zones / Defensible Space

1. Defensible space 0-30 feet from structures
  - Fuel break within 30 feet of all structures
  - Removal of all dead and dying vegetation
  - Thin out overgrown shrubs/trees/brush
  - No vegetation against structure
  - 5 to 10 foot 'immediate zone', around structure, rock/granite/hardscape
2. Reduced fuel zone 30-100 feet from structures
  - Minimum clearance between fuels surrounding structures ranging from 5-40 feet in all directions
3. Agencies that have property in High Fire Severity Zones are eligible for cost share defensible space funding thru the Diablo Fire Safe Council

## Frequently Asked Questions ?

**Q. Why are the abatement dates so late this year?**

A. Due to the late spring rains

**Q. Can the dates be pushed up?**

A. No, as there is a concern about heavy equipment sinking in the mud

**Q. Why does it take so long to abate?**

A. We are legally obligated to mail out one 14 day notice and one 10 day notice, then if the property is not abated, we write up a 'work order' and our contractor has 14 days to abate.

## Frequently Asked Questions? Continued..

**Q. Why can't heavy, thick, overgrown green vegetation be abated by the Fire District?**

A. Our Fire District standards dictate that we abate 'weeds', as they are a 'ladder fuel' to spread fire to shrubs/brush/trees/buildings

**Q. Can the Fire District abate dead trees?**

A. The Fire District can abate a dead tree that is laying down on the ground as it is a fire hazard.

**Q. What about abatement of a standing dead tree?**

A. We can suggest it but we cannot enforce it, as there is no law or ordinance stating such abatement can be enforced.

## MINIMUM WEED ABATEMENT STANDARDS



- A. **PARCELS FIVE ACRES OR LESS IN SIZE:**  
Maintain **ALL** weeds at a height of **no more than 3 inches**. Weeds and grasses must be mowed, with material mulched and scattered or raked and bagged, and removed from the property, or disced (see "Discing Quality" below). All combustible rubbish or debris, including but not limited to: cardboard boxes, pallets, trash, wood rounds/chunks, rubble, etc., shall be removed from the property. **Parcels may require additional abatement during the season due to the regrowth of weeds and other flammable vegetation.**
- B. **PARCELS GREATER THAN FIVE ACRES IN SIZE:**  
Shall be provided with **30-foot fuelbreaks and 15-foot crossbreaks** (see "H" and "I" below). Crossbreaks should divide the parcel into approximately 5-acre sections. **Fencelines may require handmowing/weedeating to ensure completion of fuelbreak.** When terrain is too steep or rugged for a tractor, a handmowed fuelbreak may be required. All cut material should be mulched and scattered or raked, bagged and removed from parcel.
- C. **Fuelbreaks along roadways** are required as part of the property line. Road right-of-ways shall be cleared to a minimum of **10 feet horizontally** from the edge of driving surface and **13'6" vertically**.
- D. **Active pastureland** shall be provided with **15-foot wide fuelbreaks and crossbreaks** if a sufficient number of animals are present to steadily reduce height of grasses during the summer months to **3 inches** or less by the end of August, irrespective of parcel size. **If this requirement cannot be met, 30-foot fuelbreaks and crossbreaks shall be required.**
- E. **Active cropland** shall be provided with **15-foot fuelbreaks** or crossbreaks if the crop is to be harvested by mid-June. If there is to be a later harvest, **30-foot fuelbreaks shall be required.**
- F. **Orchards** are to be maintained by complete abatement, including grasses under tree branches (see G. Tree litter). This may require pruning of lower branches to allow equipment access.
- G. **Tree litter** (eucalyptus leaves and bark, coniferous needles, leaves, fallen branches, etc.) shall be removed from the base of trees, tree stems, and limbs within 10 feet of the ground and maintained throughout the fire season.
- H. **30-foot fuelbreaks, where required, shall be provided** around all structures, combustible storage, trees, shrubs and brush, **along ridgelines, fencelines, ditches, and along the sides of, but not in, creeks.** Fuelbreaks and crossbreaks are a continuous strip of disced or dozed ground following as closely as possible to the property line, and **along one side of all fencelines, ditches, and on top of all ridgelines.** Remove from the property all debris, rubble, junk, piles of dirt, etc., which would obstruct or impede vehicles and/or equipment used for abatement work or fire suppression operations.
- I. **Mowed fuelbreaks** shall be 60 feet wide and **mowed crossbreaks** 30 feet wide due to ability of the remaining surface material to support a fire growth.

### DISCING QUALITY:

All discing work, including fuelbreaks, shall be completed so that all weeds, grasses, crops and other vegetation or organic material, which could be expected to burn, shall be completely turned under to the point that there is not sufficient exposed fuel to maintain or allow the spread of fire.

***NOTE: Certain properties may require additional or more stringent abatement due to site-specific issues with terrain, regrowth, location, land use, or fire related history.***

RE: Fire Chief's Report

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- North Orinda Shaded Fuel Brake (NOSFB) Project. Work continues with the Moraga-Orinda FPD, Cal Fire, and other cooperators on logistics and planning. There is no start date for work to commence as of the date of this report.
- Fire Season. Crews continue their wildland training and preparations for fire season. In addition, our fire trail program has been working fire trail maintenance since early May, and personnel are out almost every day driving the trails; identifying issues to be addressed; and ensuring gates, locks, and signage are intact and operational. Heavy equipment, including our bulldozer and a rented motor grader, is used to modify or maintain the trails.
- New Fire Engines in Service. Two new wildland firefighting engines were placed into service in May at Fire Stations 85 (Pittsburg) and 83 (Antioch). These will help us improve fleet reliability and replace two 19-year-old engines that are well beyond their normal service life.



- REACH Public Safety Helicopter Program. We continue to work on the implementation of the program with REACH. The tentative start date for the new program is August 1, 2019.
  
- Wildfire Evacuation Guide. The District worked with the Lafayette Police Department to publish the Lamorinda Wildfire Evacuation Guide on May 17, 2019. The guide was distributed to over 60,000 residents and made available on all the participating agency websites. The guide can be found at [www.cccfpd.org/pdfs/Residents\\_Guide.pdf](http://www.cccfpd.org/pdfs/Residents_Guide.pdf). We will be issuing a similar guide to be used throughout our Fire District in conjunction with many of our city partners.
