All concerned,

Contra Costa County Fire District responded to a reported vegetation fire at Evora Road and Willow Pass Road in the City of Concord. Upon arrival Engine 86 (Bay Point) reported 5-6 acres of grass and brush already burning with a rapid rate of spread and high winds. Battalion 1 arrived on scene and assumed command, calling for an additional alarm. This fire was wind driven, with extreme winds over 20MPH. Early in the incident there was a structure threat with homeowner concern and several radio towers threatened, however both were mitigated early. Unified command with CCCFPD and Cal Fire was established early in the incident and fire crews made an aggressive attack on the fire as they moved to surround it with hose lines. The fire was contained to 25 acres. The biggest concern during the incident was the fire spotting over highway 4 and creating a larger incident. The cause and origin of the fire is undetermined and is being investigated by CCCFPD Investigators. Should you have any questions feel free to call me.
